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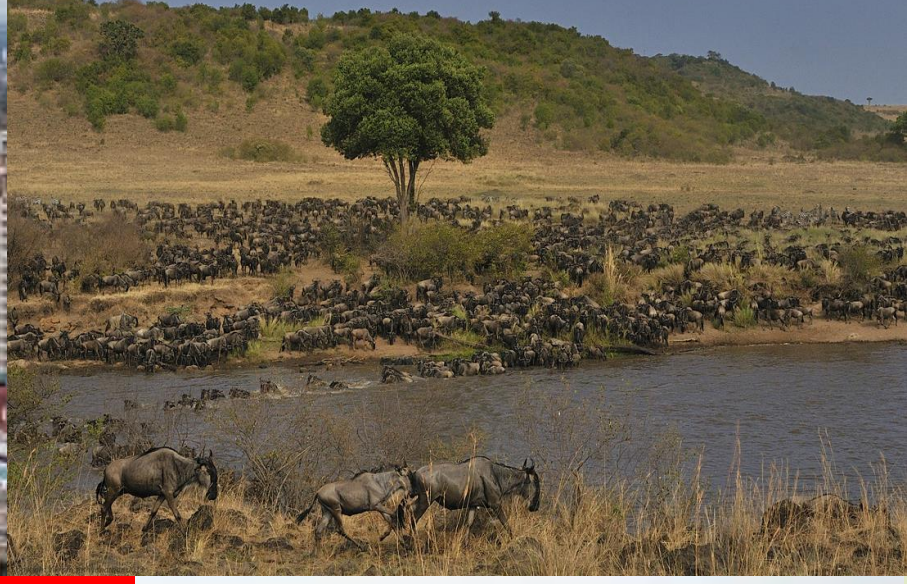

About Kenya

- **Named after;** Mt. Kenya
- **Kenya** is the Cradle of Mankind (Lake Turkana)
- **Attained independence;** on 20/10/1963
- **Population;** Estimated to be 47.6 Million
- **Official Language;** Swahili and English
- **Very religious society;** Christian, Muslims, Africa Religion, Hindu etc

More About Kenya

- **Governance**; Unitary & 47 Devolved counties
- **Capital City**: Nairobi
- **Mobile phone penetration** –Leading in Africa at 91% compared to Africa's 80%.
- **Education system** - 2-6-3-3-3 (Competency based training) since 2017
- **Literacy levels** – for 15 years and older is 81.53% (UNESCO 2018)
- **Reading Culture** – Low/ Poor reading culture

Libraries in Kenya

- **Academic libraries** (University, colleges & research institutes libraries)
- **National and public libraries** (There are 60 branches in 33 counties)
- **Community libraries** – Due to limited libraries in Kenya, we are now seeing more individuals/ NGO starting community libraries
- **School Libraries** (only 2% of the schools have libraries)
- **Special Libraries**- Very popular with research institutes

Examples of Kenyan Libraries initiatives

- Free Text book programs to all public schools
- Mobile Libraries by KNLS (Truck & Camel)
- Public libraries turning into digital hubs – Embracing E - readers
- The 2012 Constitution devolved provision of Libraries to country level



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The number of Universities in Kenya

- There are
 - 31 public chartered Universities (owned by the government),
 - 18 chartered private universities (owned by individuals or other entities).
 - There are also 14 universities operating with interim letters (CUE 2020).

NB

- 63 university libraries in Kenya
- Two main categories: Public university libraries & Private university libraries

Highlights on the state of the University Libraries in Kenya

- Majority are partially automated – Hybrid collection
- Koha is the most common LMS (est 95%)
- For security systems 3M & RFID are common
- Dspace is most popular for digital repositories
- The libraries are established & Staffing/ Teaching staff equivalent
- The Kenyan University Libraries have a very active consortium (KLISC)

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Notable Responses – Kenyan Experience

- Many publishers have developed and shared **covid19 packages** through KLISC and other partners.
 - Librarians should take the initiatives to share the information with users.
 - Don't forward everything to everyone.
 - Try to Know & profile your users in order to support them well
- Various online **Training** opportunities
 - Librarians and
 - Users eg academic writing, How to publish

Notable Responses

- ▶ Continuous **communication & Information literacy programs**
 - ▶ Live support through social media & phone calls,
 - ▶ Frequently check & respond to all emails and other queries
 - ▶ Have a schedule to share various relevant tips / Information
- ▶ Providing **Off Campus/ Remote Access** to e-resources
 - ▶ Ez Proxy
 - ▶ Remotex
 - ▶ Some databases allow users to access & use them remotely

Examples of Challenges facing the Users

- Sudden change – Users are learning/ readjusting the hard way
- Some don't have smartphones & Laptops
- The power & internet connection in the country is still poor especially in rural arrears.
- Weak social economic systems
- The cost of internet is still high
- Techno phobia / Tech anxiety
- Lack of adequate support to navigate online sources
- Information/ passwords overload
- Poor reading culture

Examples of Challenges facing the libraries & Librarians Now & post covid19

- Majority of the libraries & librarians were not prepared for the new normal
- Serious budget cuts
- Need to reorganize library space & Services
- Serious Job losses and Skills redundancy
- Users apathy in visiting physical libraries & sharing print resources
- Inadequate capacity in the library

Opportunities

Opportunities For the libraries

- Operationalize **new services** e.g. E- Support. There is limited resistance
- **Policy change** especially on ICT & e Resources
- Negotiate ICT **budget**, Training, Staff
- Consider subscription to unlimited subscribed e-books and e-journals on **perpetual access**.
- Rethink about **discovery systems & mobile apps (MYLOFT)** that are friendly

Opportunities

- Time to strongly push for adoption of ICT & new library skill especially by the staff who used to be **resistance to change**
- Establishment of a good **monitoring and evaluation system** for e resources & library usage

Opportunities For the librarians

- Time to **learn a new skill**, collaborate, publish
- **Reinvent** yourself and claim your rightful position in your institutions by being part of the solution.
- Watch out for **training** opportunities especially
